Ron Kirsch joined the Board of Directors for the Habitat for Humanity Williamson-Maury in October 2012, chairing the Safety and Nominations Committees. He grew up in a small town near Milwaukee, Wisconsin and moved to Cleveland, Tennessee when he was 12 years old. Ron completed his Bachelor of Science degree at Middle Tennessee State University in 1983. He received his master's and PhD both from LaSalle University.

Ron has known his spouse, Kim Johnson Kirsch, since high school. They started dating while in college at MTSU and married in 1986. They have two sons, Hunter and Matthew, both of whom graduated from Ravenwood High School. Hunter resides in the greater Nashville area, and Matthew is a student at Baylor University.
